Host: Hemlocks

What: 1/16" to 1/4" white, woolly masses, cotton ball-like texture

Where: Attached to undersides of twigs towards the branch tips

When: Present year round, most visible November through July

Please look for this pest: **Elongate Hemlock Scale**

Hosts: Hemlocks, firs, and other conifers

What:

- Scale coverings: smooth, waxy, yellow-brown (female) or fluffy, white (male)
- White, thread-like floss
- Mottled, yellowing needles

Where: Undersides of needles

When: Present year round
