#### Minutes of Meeting #140 Feb 14, 2018

The Maine Public Drinking Water Commission (DWC) held its 140th meeting on Feb 14, 2018 at the Key Bank Plaza, Augusta Maine.

#### **Present Were:**

**Members:** Jeff LaCasse, Rebecca Laliberte, Brian Richardson, Kathy Moriarty, Carol White, Bob MacKinnon, Tom Brennan, and Mike Plaziak. Jim Willis, Board Clerk

Time: Jeff called the meeting to order at 9:10 AM

#### A. APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Minutes from the last meeting were approved as written.

#### **B. RECURRING BUSINESS:**

#### 1. ELECTION OF CHAIR AND VICE-CHAIR

Election of Chair and Vice-Chair took place.
Kathy Moriarty is Chair and Tom Brennan is Vice-Chair for 2018.

#### 2. DWC MEMBERSHIP UPDATE-REAPPOINTMENT STATUS

Jeff talked about his upcoming retirement in April 2018 from the Kennebec Water District, and the possibility of he and Kathy switching seats on the Drinking Water Commission. Jim Willis stated he would call the Governor's office and see what the steps are to switch Jeff and Kathy's seats and get back to them. Currently all seats are current.

#### 3. PURPOSE OF THE MAINE DRINKING WATER COMMISSION

Brian requested to discuss what the purpose of the DWC is. There was a discussion among the commission members answering Brian's questions.

#### 4. DWP STAFFING UPDATE

Mike stated that Roger Crouse resigned as the Maine drinking Water Program director. Mike stated he will be the Interim DWP Director until That position is filled.

Mike also stated that Glenn Angell, the State Site Evaluator retired at the end of January. Mike said the DWP is moving in the same direction as before.

#### 5. SFY 2018 AFM FEE COLLECTION STATUS

Mike stated that we are currently at a 97.9 percent collection rate \$555,674 which is slightly above previous years. There was discussion about sending 3<sup>rd</sup> notice AFM bills by certified mail.

#### 6. DWP FINANCIAL REPORT

Mike discussed the DWP financial report.

#### 7. LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

Mike discussed LD-40 testing for lead in drinking water in schools. Mike talked about how the DWP is looking at schools that are regulated and where the sample sites are.

#### 8. DRINKING WATER RULE MAKING

Mike discussed that we are in the process of updating the rules regarding Monthly Operating Reports (MOR'S).

# 9. SAMPLING PROJECTS – PER AND POLYFLUORALKYL (PFAS'S)/CYANOTOXINS

Mike discussed some of the sampling results for the project being done by the DWP to test for cyanotoxins and PFAS's in various parts of Maine.




