Subject: Product Registration, Infiltrator ATL System

Dear Mr. Bachelder:

The Division of Environmental Health has completed a review of a registration application for the subject products. This information was submitted pursuant to Section 6.HH of the Subsurface Wastewater Disposal Rules for registration for use in Maine.

The Infiltrator ATL System is a multiple component system for the treatment of domestic wastewater. It consists of six concentric components: a four inch diameter pipe, large-diameter synthetic aggregate; coarse geotextile; small diameter synthetic aggregate; fine geotextile; and six inches of ASTM C33 system sand. The first five components comprise cylindrical units which are bedded in the ASTM C33 sand. There is a minimum of 12 inches of sand between the units, six inches of sand below the units, and none above the units. The units are rated at 5.0 square feet of effective area per linear foot.

According to the information you provided, the Infiltrator ATL System has been certified by the National Sanitation Foundation (NSF) pursuant to ANSI/NSF Standard 40 for residential wastewater treatment systems.

On the basis of the information, the Division has determined that the Infiltrator ATL System is acceptable for use as a proprietary disposal field product in the State of Maine, provided that it is installed, operated, and maintained in conformance with the manufacturer's directions.

Because installation and owner maintenance has a significant effect on the working order of onsite sewage disposal systems, including their components, the Division makes no representation or guarantee as to the efficiency and/or operation of Infiltrator ATL System. Further, registration of this product for use in the State of Maine does not represent Division preference or recommendation for this product over similar or competing products.
