Area - 49 acres Average depth - 4 feet Maximum depth - 6 feet Temperatures: Surface - 77⁰F

Principal fishery: Brook trout

Fourth Pelletier Brook Lake is shallow with about equal water temperatures at all depths When water temperatures warm during hot summer months, spring inflow is crucial to providing sufficient cold water to sustain the trout population.

The trout fishery in the lake is maintained entirely by natural spawning within the pond and in spring inlets. Conservative fishing regulations have been implemented to maintain and enhance the sport fishery.

Two-wheel drive access near the pond is via improved private gravel roads maintained by industrial landowners for forest management purposes. An unmarked foot trail leads to the lake from the gravel road.
