Bennett Lake is a small, shallow, spring fed lake with abundant aquatic vegetation. Summer water temperatures remain sufficiently cool to support brook trout. The lake was reclaimed in 1956 to allow intensive trout management.

The barrier dam on the outlet, built to prevent undesirable species of fish from re-entering the lake, has washed out twice. Construction of a satisfactory barrier dam is infeasible due to lack of good sites available.

Suckers and minnows have become reestablished in Bennett Lake and are competing heavily with brook trout.

No known public access is available to Bennett Lake.
