Dickey Pond is a shallow, weedy pond located on Dickey Brook, a tributary to Cross Lake. Water temperatures, about equal from top to bottom, become warm during hot weather.

This pond is suitable for trout during the spring and fall and during cool periods in the summer. Dickey Brook contains excellent trout spawning and nursery areas. Movement of trout from the brook into the pond is probably common during periods when water levels are high and temperatures are cool.

Dickey Pond is accessible by a one mile canoe trip through a deadwater on the main inlet.
