Dickwood Lake is surrounded by approximately 3,860 acres of state owned wildlife management area that was acquired in 1989 with bond money for land acquisition. An additional adjacent 500 acres is owned by the town of Eagle Lake.

Dickwood Lake is shallow with equal temperatures from surface to bottom during the critical summer months. Trout seek cool spring areas to survive during the warm weather. A large population of suckers reduces trout production by competing for available food and space.

Access to Dickwood Lake is via gravel road suited for 2-wheel drive travel with occasional 4x4 sections due to washed out culverts. No improved landing exists and a ten-minute foot path completes access to the pond.
