

Dimock Pond, a small, spring-fed pond, provides good habitat for brook trout. When water temperatures become warm during hot weather, trout seek areas of cool spring seepage.

Spawning and nursery areas for trout in Dimock Pond are very limited, and survey findings indicate a low trout population. The small minnows present should not seriously reduce trout production by competing for food or space.
