Fischer Lake is completely ringed by cattails and alders with several reverting potato fields visible from the pond. Fischer Lake provides marginal brook trout habitat and supports a limited brook trout population.

Fischer Lake was chemically reclaimed in 1958 along with Monson Pond to reduce populations of competing species, and to reestablish a brook trout fishery. Although successful in greatly reducing competition for food and space for a few years, the above species have since become established.
