Physical Characteristics

Area - 29 acres Temperatures: Average depth - 12 feet Surface - 68° F Maximum depth - 31 feet 25 feet - 48° F

Principal fisheries: Brook trout, brown trout, white perch, chain pickerel

Green Pond provides good habitat for chain pickerel and seasonally good habitat for brook and brown trout. An oxygen deficiency below 15 feet occurs during summer months that eliminates most potential trout habitat. Trout likely utilize Green Pond during cooler months in spring, fall, and winter by movement within the Meduxnekeag River that flows through the eastern end of the pond.

Green Pond can be accessed only by permission from local landowners.
