
Grey Pond is located in a wooded, hilly area between Ross (Chemquassabamticook) Stream and Long Lake in the Allagash River drainage. This pond contained only minnows at the time of the initial survey but water quality was favorable for brook trout. An experimental socking of 1,400 brook trout was conducted in the fall of 1974 to see if a sport fishery could be produced. No trout were captured in follow-up sampling conducted in July, 1975. It is apparent that the pond is not capable of sustaining trout through the winter months and no trout have been stocked since.

Grey Pond has no significant tributaries and the outlet is very small containing little trout habitat.

Access is via private gravel roads built and maintained by industrial landowners for forest management purposes. A short walk completes access to the pond.
