Jones Pond is a small pond located in northern Aroostook County that provides excellent habitat to support a wild trout population. Water below the 10-foot level is cold in late summer with ample oxygen to support brook trout. Aquatic insects and minnows provide ideal forage for trout growth.

The trout population in Jones Pond is maintained entirely by natural reproduction along the shoreline and in spring areas within the pond. Much of the shoreline is composed of gravel that is ideal for trout spawning.

Conservative fishing regulations have been established to protect the wild trout population.

Access is via private gravel roads built and maintained by industrial landowners for forest management purposes. A short footpath completes access to the pond.
