Logan Lake is a small, clearwater pond that has good habitat for brook trout. A forested shoreline of spruce and cedar and a small wetland at the outlet of the pond offers an ideal outdoor setting within relatively short distance of downtown Houlton. Few wild trout occur in the pond and the fishery is supplemented with hatchery brook trout.

Conservative regulations have been implemented to maintain and enhance sport fishery opportunities.

Access to Logan Lake can be obtained by an ATV trail that crosses the McDonald road in the town of Littleton.
