Pennington Pond is a small, undeveloped water with a cedar shoreline and hardwood hills visible in the distance. It is shallow and becomes warm at all depths during late summer. Summer carrying capacity for trout is limited to a few areas of spring influence. A limited amount of trout spawning and nursery areas are available in small spring tributaries.

Access is via private gravel roads built and maintained by large landowners for forest management purposes. An unimproved footpath completes access to Pennington Pond.
