

Round Mountain Pond is a very picturesque small pond surrounded by a forested shoreline. The pond sits in a bowl created by Round Mountain rising from the southwest shoreline and a smaller ridge rising from the northwest edge of the water.

Water quality is suitable for brook trout, as the water remains cool and well oxygenated during late summer. Abundant populations of yellow perch and white sucker compete with trout for food and space keeping wild trout numbers low. The pond receives an annual stocking of brook trout to improve the sport fishery. Splake, a hybrid charr, are stocked infrequently to take advantage of the available habitat and to provide an opportunity to catch larger and older fish. Salmon occasionally travel up the outlet from Rowe Lake and are caught in Round Mountain Pond.

Conservative fishing regulations have been established to spread the catch of hatchery fish throughout the summer.

Vehicle access is via private gravel roads built and maintained by industrial landowners for forest management purposes. Watercraft may be hand carried from a logging road is located on the southwest shore.
