Suggested Managament

Sowish Lake is a small, shallow lake situated in a lowland region southwest of Glazier Lake on the Maine-Ouebec border. A cedar/tamarack swamp surrounds much of the lake; spruce, fir, and an occasional pine inhabit higher ground on the east and south shores. Much of the lake and spring tibutaries are lightly silted, with very little trout spawning habitat A large beaver dam on the observed. outlet is presently maintaining a water level such that suitable brook trout habitat exists within the lake. At the same time, however, the dam prevents fish passage which may be important for maintaining the trout population in the lake.

Due to the small size of Sowish Lake and the limited amount of colder water, conservative regulations will be necessary to maintain the brook trout fishery.

An improved gravel road passes within 250 feet of the lake.
