Two Mile Pond is considered excellent brook trout habitat. Abundant springs maintain desirable water temperatures for trout throughout the year.


The one kind of minnow present is not a serious factor in reducing trout production by competing for food or space. However, no new kinds of fish should be introduced into the pond.

Trout spawning areas in gravelly spring seepages along the shores appear to be adequate to maintain the trout fishery with present fishing pressure. The pond is presently limited to a 5-trout bag limit, and use or possession of live fish as bait is prohibited.

Two Mile Pond is accessible by a one-half-mile trail from an improved gravel road.
