Browns Pond is a shallow body of water with a limited area of deeper water located to the west and north of the island. The shoreline is undeveloped, and the pond provides a unique angling experience with a remote type of atmosphere.

This water is best suited for warmwater fisheries management. Yellow perch and pickerel fishing is good, but most anglers are attracted by the black crappie fishery. Black crappie were illegal introduced sometime between the late 1980's to early 1990's.

Access into Browns Pond is limited to a four-wheeled drive road located off Route 107. The pond is located approximately 2 miles in on the right.
