Lower Mud Pond is surrounded by wetlands. The water is very dark in color and there is little floating or emergent vegetation. The water quality indicates that the pond would be a marginal as a trout pond due to low oxygen levels in the deeper cool water layers during the late summer.


Chemical reclamation is not possible because due to wetlands around the shoreline and lack of a suitable place on the outlet to build a barrier dam. It is recommended that Lower Mud Pond be managed for the warmwater species already present.

There is no public access to this pond. Existing access is limited to walk-in across private property.
