Principal fisheries: Brook trout, chain pickerel, and yellow perch

Owl Pond, located west of Parker Pond on Pine Hill in Casco, provides a remote setting for trout and pickerel fishing. The pond is open in the winter as well as the summer. Stocked brook trout are the attraction in the spring or early summer, while pickerel and yellow perch provide most of the winter action.

An oxygen deficiency that develops below 10 feet during the summer months, and an abundant population of pickerel and yellow perch limits the potential for trout management. Brook trout are stocked each spring by aircraft and provide a marginal summer fishery.

Owl Pond has always been a popular winter destination for anglers seeking fast action in a remote setting.

Walk-in access is available across private property. A logging road originating on the east shore of Parker Pond leads to the pond.
