Crosby Pond is located south of Louise Mountain near the Canadian border. Its inlet enters at the north end of the pond and the outlet flows south into Lower Hathan Bog. The pond's wooded shoreline is undeveloped.

Brook trout growth is good in Crosby Pond despite marginal water quality and competition from other species. Water below 15 feet is lacking in oxygen during the summer months and large numbers of minnows and suckers compete for available food. The inlet has a gravel substrate that offers good spawning habitat for brook trout.

Crosby Pond is accessible by foot via a gated private road. The pond is open to fly fishing only with special regulations in the summer and closed in the winter.
