Physical Characteristics

Area - 12 acres

Temperatures: Surface - 73°F 25 feet - 45°F

Maximum depth - 27 feet

Principal fishery: Brook trout

Day Mountain Pond is located north of Day Mountain. Its small inlet enters the pond from the west and its outlet flows east into the Sandy River. The pond's shoreline is undeveloped.

Water quality in Day Mountain Pond is good for coldwater gamefish. Spawning habitat is present in the inlet and along the shoreline. A self-sustaining population of brook trout utilizes this area to maintain a fishery. Trout growth is good with only light competition. The pond is not stocked.

Day Mountain Pond is accessible via logging road off Route 4. The pond is open to fly fishing only in the summer and closed in the winter months. See the lawbook for special regulations.
