Dodge Pond is located north of Rangeley Lake. Its major inlet enters the pond at the north end from nearby Round Pond and the outlet flows west into Hunter Cove of Rangeley Lake. The pond's shoreline is mostly developed.

Water quality in Dodge Pond is good for coldwater gamefish. Good spawning and nursery habitat located in the main inlet supplies the pond with native brook trout and salmon. The salmon are slow growing, but brook trout growth is good despite heavy competition for food and space from other fish species. The pond is stocked annually with brook trout to supplement the wild population.

Dodge Pond is accessible from Routes 4 and 16. The pond is open to fishing with no live fish as bait in the summer and closed to fishing in the winter months.
