Fellows Pond is located on the east side of the Chesterville Esker. The pond's inlet enters at the south end and its outlet, McGurdy Stream, leaves the east side flowing north toward the Sandy River. The pond's shoreline is undeveloped.

Water quality in Fellows Pond is poor for coldwater gamefish with warm temperatures at all depths during the summer. Warmwater species dominate with largemouth bass providing an attractive fishery. The pond is not stocked. Fellows Pond is accessible via a gravel road off the Ridge Road. The pond is open to fishing under general law in both the summer and winter seasons.
