Flatiron Pond is located on the north side of Spotted Mountain. Two small inlets enter in the southwest corner of the pond and its outlet, Flatiron Brook, flows northeast into nearby Kennebago Lake. The pond's shoreline is undeveloped.

Water quality in Flatiron Pond is good for coldwater gamefish Wild populations of brook trout spawn on the shore to support a good fishery. The pond is not stocked.

Flatiron Pond is accessible by a foot trail from the east end of Kennebago Lake or via a series of logging roads from the west. The pond is open to fly fishing only with special regulations in the summer and closed to fishing in the winter months.
