Little Hammond Pond is located east of Burnt Hill. A small inlet enters the west side of the pond and its outlet flows east into the Carrabassett River. The pond's shoreline is undeveloped.

Water temperatures in Little Hammond Pond reach critically high levels in the warm summer months. Brook trout must seek refuge in cool springs to survive. Spawning and nursery habitat is available in the inlet and outlet to support the native trout population. Trout growth is good without competition from other fish species.

Little Hammond Pond is accessible via a logging road west of Route 27. It is open to general law fishing in the summer and closed to ice fishing.
