

Horseshoe Pond is located east of Arnold Pond. Its main inlet enters the west end of the pond from nearby Mud Pond. The pond's outlet, Horseshoe Stream, flows southeast into Chain of Ponds. The pond's shoreline is undeveloped.

Water quality in Horseshoe Pond is marginal for coldwater gamefish. Ample spawning and nursery habitat is available in the Horseshoe Stream for brook trout and salmon, but the large numbers of yellow perch and suckers overcome them for food and space. The pond is not stocked.

Horseshoe Pond is accessible via a gravel side road to Route 27. The pond is open to fly fishing only in the summer and closed to fishing in the winter.
