Jim Pond is located east of Shallow Pond Mountain. Jim Pond Brook and the Northwest Inlet enter the north shore of the pond and its outlet, Jim Pond Brook, flows south through Mud Pond into the North Branch of the Dead River. The pond's shoreline is lightly developed.

Water quality in Jim Pond is good for coldwater gamefish and fisheries for brook trout, lake trout and salmon are present. Wild brook trout spawn in the tributaries and a native lake trout utilize the rocky shoreline to maintain their populations. Salmon are stocked regularly to offer opportunity for this species. Growth is good with all salmonids growing to attractive sizes.

Jim Pond is accessible from a boat ramp reached via a series of gravel logging road off Route 27. The pond is open to fishing with a no live fish as bait regulation in the summer and closed to fishing in the winter months. See the lawbook for additional regulations.
