Mud Pond is located north of Noon Mountain. The pond has no major inlet, but an outlet flows north into the Sandy River. The pond's shoreline is undeveloped.

Water quality in Mud Pond is suitable for coldwater gamefish. Water levels are dependent on the condition of the beaver dam on the outlet. Without spawning and nursery available habitats, annual stockings of brook trout are required in order to provide a fishery. Growth is good with no competition from other fish species.

Mud Pond is accessible via a 4-wheel drive road off Route 4. It is open to fishing with artificial lures only in the open water season and is closed to fishing throughout the winter months. See the lawbook for additional regulations.
