Norcross Pond is located southwest of the Chesterville Esker. Its inlet flows in at the south end from Mosher Pond. The outlet flows north into Little Norridgewock Stream. The north and east shorelines are developed.

Water quality is marginal for coldwater gamefish with warm temperatures in the upper levels and oxygen deficiency in the lower levels. Spawning habitat for coldwater species is poor. Brown trout are stocked to provide a coldwater fishery. Norcross Pond also has good fisheries for warmwater species.

Norcross Pond is accessible from a gravel launch site off the Ridge Road. The pond is open to general law fishing in both the summer and winter seasons.
