Redington Pond is located east of Sugarloaf Mountain. Small inlets enter the pond from all sides and its outlet flows north into the Carrabassett River. The pond's shoreline is undeveloped.

Water quality in Redington Pond is marginal for coldwater gamefish. Water temperatures reach critically high levels in this shallow pond. Limited spawning and nursery habitat is utilized by a small native brook trout population. These fish are slow growing due to heavy competition from the numerous minnows and suckers, but provide a limited fishery. The pond is not stocked.

Redington Pond is accessible via a road leading south off Route 27. The pond is open to fishing under general law in the summer months and closed to ice fishing. See the lawbook for additional regulations.
