

Round Pond is located east of Ephraim Ridge. Two small inlets enter from the north and the pond's short outlet flows south into nearby Dodge Pond. The pond's shoreline is lightly developed.

Water quality in Round Pond is good for coldwater gamefish. Populations of brook trout and salmon utilize spawning and nursery habitat in both the inlet and outlet. Brook trout are stocked to supplement the native fish and maintain a fishery. Trout growth is good despite heavy competition from other fish species. Salmon growth and survival are poor, so this species provides only a limited fishery.

Round Pond is accessible via a launch site reached on a gravel road off the Dodge Pond Road. The pond is open to fly fishing only throughout the summer months and is closed to ice fishing. See the lawbook for additional regulations.
