Middle Sandy River Pond, located southwest of Saddleback Mountain, is the largest in a series of three ponds. There are two separate basins that are connected by a thoroughfare. A short inlet flows in from Upper Sandy River Pond to the west. There are other small tributaries that enter the pond. Its short outlet flows east into nearby Lower Sandy River Pond. The shoreline is lightly developed.


Water quality in Middle Sandy River Pond is good for coldwater gamefish. Spawning habitat is limited, so annual stockings of brook trout are necessary to provide a fishery.

Trout growth is good despite competition from other fish species for food and space.

Middle Sandy River Pond is accessible via a gravel road off Route 4. The pond is open to fishing in the summer with live bait being prohibited. It is closed to icefishing. See the lawbook for additional regulations.
