Secret Pond is located west of Boil Mountain. Its inlet flows into the east end of the pond and its outlet flows west into the Kennebago River. The pond's shoreline is undeveloped.

Water quality in Secret Pond is good for coldwater gamefish. The natural population of brook trout is slow growing, despite only lake chubs to compete with for food and space. The pond is not stocked.

Secret Pond is inaccessible to the general public due to private gated roads. The pond is open to fly fishing only in the open water fishing season and closed in the winter.
