The Horns Pond is located on the western side of The Horn on the Bigelow Mountain Range. There are no major inlets, but a steep outlet flows north toward Flagstaff Lake. The pond's shoreline is undeveloped.

Water quality in The Horns Pond is good for coldwater gamefish. A brook trout fishery is maintained through annual fry stockings. Trout growth is good with no competition from other fish species.

The Horns Pond is accessible only via foot trails. The Appalachian Trail passes along the southern edge of the pond. The Horns Pond Trail crosses the outlet of Stratton Brook Pond to the south and leads to the pond also. The pond is open to fishing under general law in the summer

and closed to icefishing. See the lawbook for additional regulations.
