

Toothaker Pond is located east of Madrid Junction. It has no major inlets, but an outlet flows west into Orbeton Stream near the Sandy River. The pond's shoreline is mostly developed.

Water quality in Toothaker Pond is poor for coldwater gamefish. The pond has a history of algal blooms caused by cultural eutrophication. The water is warm from top to bottom with an oxygen deficiency in the lower depths. The pond is not stocked on a routine basis.

Toothaker Pond is accessible via the Toothaker Pond Road. The pond is open to fishing with no live fish as bait in the summer and closed to fishing in the winter.
