

Upper Breakneck Pond is a small, shallow, weedy, clear-water pond located in scenic Acadia National Park on Mount Desert Island. Most of the pond's surface is covered with lily pads, and other aquatic plants cover much of the bottom. Access requires either walking or bicycling for about 1 1/2 miles along a park carriage road if you want to fish this pond. Go in at the Eagle Lake entrance. Because of the soft, boggy shoreline, fishing from shore is difficult, but not impossible.

Upper Breakneck is being managed for brook trout through annual stockings of fall fingerlings to sustain the fishery. The pond is closed to ice fishing.
