There are two Green Lakes in Township 35 MD; this one is located about 2 miles south of the so-called "Stud Mill Road". The closest access is over the 35-00-0 road. It is possible to drive quite close to the pond and carry in a canoe.

Green Lake is an unusually rocky lake with a high degree of turbidity. Although anglers may occasionally catch a trout that has moved in from adjoining waters, the lake is unsuited for trout during the summer months. No stocking is recommended.

We recommend management for the assemblage of warmwater species that currently inhabit Green Lake - white perch, pickerel, and hornpout. The lake is only lightly fished.
