Killman Pond is mostly surrounded by stands of softwood along a rocky shore. The outlet lies in a low area of spruce and cedar swamp.

Brook trout are not abundant in Killman Pond. An oxygen deficiency exists in waters cool enough to support a good trout population.

There are no inlets and the single outlet through the swamp is unsuited for trout reproduction. Trout reproduction probably takes place in areas of spring influence in the pond.

Due to the marginal habitat conditions of the pond stocking is not recommended. The pond is, and should remain, under general fishing law regulation during the open water season, and be closed to ice fishing.

Killman Pond is located within 100 feet of a well traveled gravel road which goes from Lakeville to Grand Lake Stream.

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
