## Principal Fishery: Brook trout

Little Long Pond is a shallow, narrow impoundment separated from the ocean by a narrow seawall. A private land owner allows public access through a gate. An area is present where canoes/small boats can be launched.

Most of the time, the small outlet does not flow into the ocean as it is blocked by the stony seawall. However, periodically there is a clear channel to the ocean, and at such times, limited numbers of sea-run brookies may be caught by anglers. The inlet, Jordan Stream, supports a fairly good population of juvenile brook trout. Some of these fish drop down into the pond at times, grow well, and provide a modest fishery for 9 to 14-inch trout.

The pond is full of baitfish including golden shiners and banded killifish. Some fishermen take advantage of this and use this water as a source of live bait.
