Moulton Pond is located in the hill country around Lucerene in Maine. Presently, there is no public access.

An experimental brown trout stocking program was initiated in 1980. These stockings succeeded in establishing a generally satisfactory fishery. The pond proved to be a productive habitat as it yielded fair numbers of 3 to 4 pound trout along with some trophy-size fish in the 6 to 9 pound range. The two largest brown trout(known to be stocked fish) caught in Downeast Maine came from this pond. Brown trout grew extremely well by feeding on smelts, small white perch, and sunfish. Unfortunately, public access was lost in the mid-1980's, and the stocking program was terminated in 1987.

The pond provides a limited fishery for a few wild brook trout produced in a gravelly spring area. White perch provide a modest fishery, but many are in the 6 to 8 inch range.
