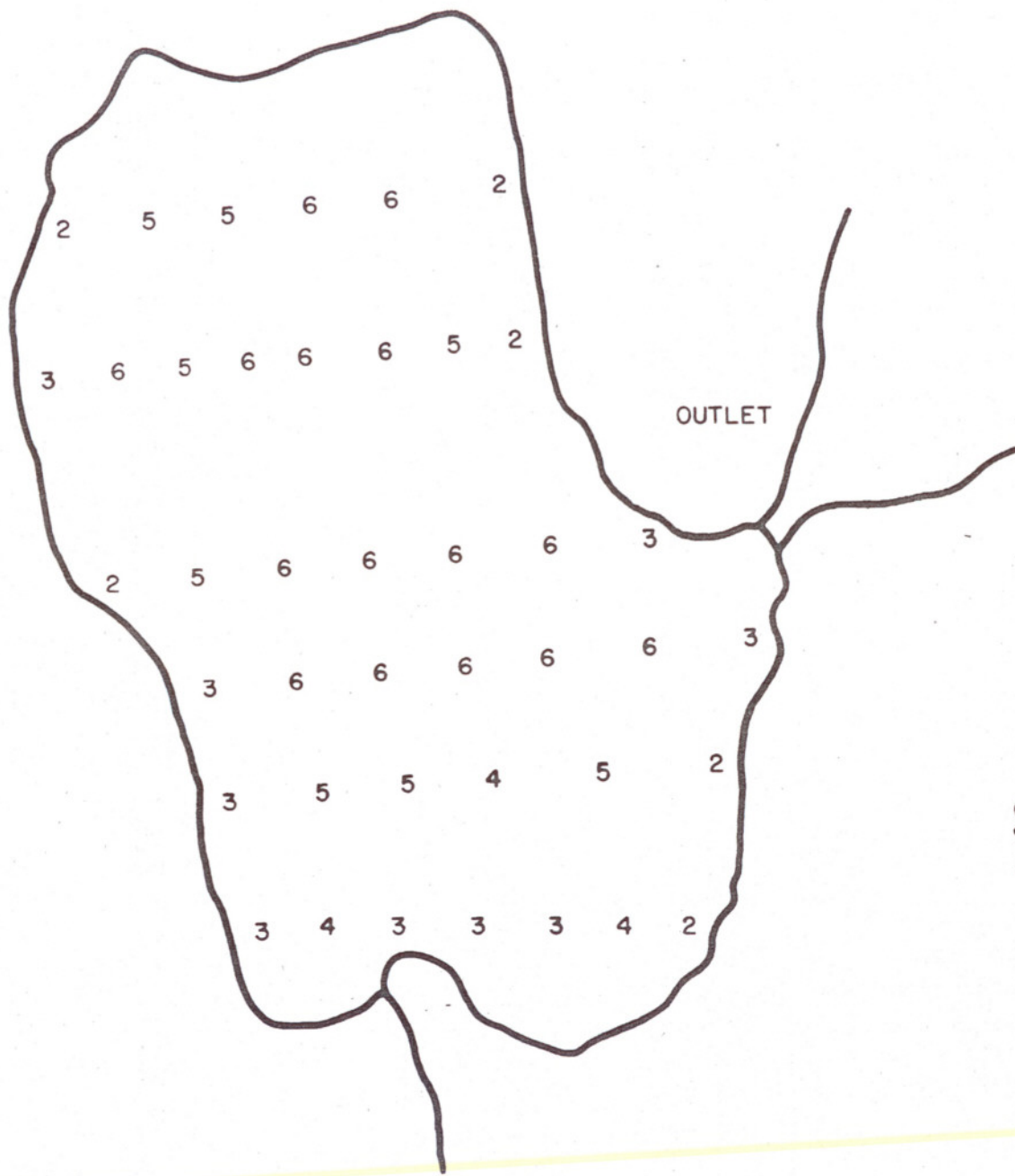
Stiles Lake is a shallow, warm, boggy lake located in relatively remote northeastern Hancock County. It drains into the West Branch of the Machias River. You can get there by way of the so-called Sabao road from Rt. 9, the "Airline". The road is a truck or jeep road. There is no boat landing.

Pickerel, hornpout and suckers are well-established. We recommend management for pickerel and hornpout.

No stocking of any kind is needed in this warmwater environment.
