

Tilden Pond is one of several small, picturesque ponds draining into Downing Pond and then into Tunk Stream. To get there, take the trail leading from the north end of the sand beach on the west end of Spring River Lake and bear a little northeast after passing Mud Pond.

Surrounded by steep hills, Tilden is popular among anglers who enjoy fishing small brook trout ponds in remote areas. Regular stockings of fall fingerling brook trout are necessary to help support the fishery. Forage fish are abundant and Tilden Pond produces some good catches of attractive-size trout each year. Since fishing pressure is comparatively light, ice fishing is permitted.

The outlet should be kept free of obstructions to fish migration.
