

Brainard Pond is a small pond east of Readfield Depot. Access is via a foot path off either Maine State Route 17 or the Plains Road.

Water quality at Brainard Pond is not suitable for coldwater sportfish management. Largemouth bass were stocked 1967 at Mill Pond and have migrated upstream to Brainard Pond where they have become well established. The bass and other warmwater fish, especially yellow perch, offer wonderful fishing opportunity both summer and winter.
