Buker Pond is one of several ponds in the Tacoma Lakes chain offering good fishing for bass, pickerel, and white perch. Brown trout are sometimes caught. These trout are probably fish that emigrated from Sand Pond where trout are stocked annually. Stocking of any trout species is not recommended due to the lack of good quality cold water habitat.

A state owned boat ramp is located at the north end of Buker Pond. Boaters can also access Sand Pond from this facility. This facility does not offer space for parking therefore, boaters are cautioned to use care and common courtesy when parking along the Bonin Road.
