Hutchinson Pond is a small shallow pond with abundant warmwater fish habitat. Largemouth bass became established in the pond by migrating up the outlet from Cobbosseesontee Stream and now provide a sport fishery.

Brown trout were experimentally stocked from 1941-1943. This stocking program was terminated when brown trout failed to survive to older ages.

Access to Hutchinson Pond is limited to walk-in only. An unimproved road leads off the Benson Road, but becomes impassable to vehicle traffic. The pond can be accessed via the outlet which crosses the Collins Road.
