

## JIMMY POND Litchfield Twp., Kennebec County U.S.G.S. Purgatory, Maine

**Physical Characteristics** 

Area - 40 acres

Maximum depth - 32 feet

Temperatures: Surface - 72<sup>0</sup>F 30 feet - 44<sup>0</sup>F

Principal fisheries: Smallmouth bass, largemouth bass, chain pickerel, white perch

Jimmy Pond is the upper most pond in the Tacoma Lakes chain. The pond has a severe oxygen deficiency in water deeper than 15 feet during the summer months, thereby eliminating management of coldwater sport fish species. The warmwater sport fishery is considered excellent.

Brown trout are occasionally caught in Jimmy Pond primarily during the ice fishing season, a result of fish migrating from Sand Pond where brown trout are stocked annually.

There is no direct shoreline access to Jimmy Pond but a trailerable boat launch site is located on Buker Pond a short distance down stream. This site also provides access to Sand Pond.
