

Largemouth bass Chain pickerel Minnows Golden shiner Hornpout (bullhead) American eel

Physical Characteristics

Area - 21 acres Temperatures:

Surface - 75°F 18 feet - 52°F

Maximum depth - 18 feet

Principal fishery: Chain pickerel

Joice Pond is a small warmwater pond with poor summer water quality.

Largemouth bass were introduced in 1976 after the Department received requests from the public. A self-supporting bass population became established from this initial stocking, but the quality of the fishery is unknown.

Biologists have investigated a couple of reported fish kills in Joice Pond. The cause of these fish kills was believed to be due to low dissolved oxygen levels.
