Physical Characteristics

Area - 18 acres Temperatures: Surface - 79°F

Maximum depth - 23 feet 20 feet - 53°F

Principal fisheries: Smallmouth bass, white perch, chain pickerel

Kezar Pond is a small pond best suited for warmwater sport fish. An over-abundance of white perch provide an excellent food source for smallmouth bass. Even though the smallmouth bass spawning habitat is limited a good sport fishery is maintained.

Access is limited to walk-in traffic only.
