Mud Pond has ideal conditions for warmwater species such as largemouth bass. The abundant aquatic vegetation provides cover and feeding areas for bass. Water temperatures and oxygen levels are optimum for fish growth through the summer months.

Beaver dams on the outlets of small shallow ponds can be very important. The historic presence of small beaver dams on the outlet of Mud Pond has maintained and stabilized the water level. Mud Pond lies at the base of Porcupine Hill approximately a quarter of mile from the nearest traveled road. Access is via an old woods road and trail.
